An overview of the program

THREE STREAMS OF IGNATIAN FORMATION

Based on the formation needs identified in our schools, three streams will be offered for your choice:

- * **WISE (Workshop on Ignatian Spirituality in Education):** Envisioned as an ongoing formation on **Ignatian spirituality** as the foundation of our work in education, intended for both our teaching and non-teaching staff members, including our schools' top management.
- * **TILT (Training in Ignatian Learning & Teaching):** Designed to train teachers and academic heads in the philosophy and principles of **Ignatian pedagogy**, as well as the characteristics of **Jesuit education**.
- * **WISL (Workshop on Ignatian School Leadership):** Conceptualized as an ongoing formation in **Ignatian leadership** for our school heads, principals, and middle-level administrators.

MODULE DESCRIPTIONS

Each module runs for five full days and tackles a significant area of formation essential for the Ignatian educator. The modules described below are also identified according to their stream and a recommended sequence (WISE, TILT, or WISL).

“THE PRINCIPLE & FOUNDATION OF JESUIT EDUCATION” (WISE 1 & TILT 1)

Provides an overview of the history and tradition of Jesuit education and invites Ignatian educators to appreciate their personal vocation in the context of the Jesuit mission of education, as well as to appropriate “The Characteristics of Jesuit Education.” Recommended for both teaching and non-teaching staff.

“NURSING THE CONTEMPLATIVE-IN-ACTION WITHIN” (WISL 1 & WISE 2)

Offers a practical guide for Ignatian educators to practice Ignatian discernment in their lives, especially in their work in schools and encourages them to build a healthy self-awareness so crucial to authentic discernment. Essential for those who are—or will be—in positions of authority.

“IGNATIAN CONVERSATION & COMPANIONSHIP” (WISL 2 & WISE 3)

Provides an intensive training on mentoring and coaching based on the approach of “holy conversations” and recommended as an instrument of *cura personalis* (personal care) for our new and more junior staff. Intended for school leaders, administrators, and veteran teachers.

“IGNATIAN TEACHING & LEARNING PROGRAM” (TILT 2)

Designed for senior teachers and administrators who seek ongoing formation for themselves and their school communities in relation to Ignatian spirituality, Ignatian Pedagogy, significant educational trends, and the global network of Jesuit secondary educational institutions.

“CONVERSATIONS ON IGNATIAN PEDAGOGY” (TILT 3)

Offers opportunities for professional conversations on the practice of Ignatian pedagogy, its issues, and challenges in order to learn from one another's best practices. Proposes a particular approach that embeds the IPP in the teachers' unit or lesson plans. Intended for our more experienced teachers and especially academic heads.

“COMMUNAL DISCERNMENT & IGNATIAN DECISION-MAKING” (WISL 3)

Trains Ignatian leaders, administrators, and other senior practitioners in the basics of Ignatian communal discernment and offers them a concrete template in employing its principles, if desired, in the more major decision-making processes of the school. Suitable especially for those who have completed the basic course in Ignatian discernment, “Nursing the Contemplative-in-Action Within” (WISL 1/WISE 2).
